- R&D, demonstration
- information & dissemination

- Pricing, taxation
- Competition
- Investment



1 - Pricing: economy favours smart moves

- London: –34% cars
- Excellent preparation, fair scheme
- ... And a man with a mission
- EU initiative lorry pricing restrictive
- ... so pricing becomes unattractive







2 - Public transport and competition

- Politicians underestimate support
- ... but companies should be clean and deliver at reasonable cost
- Controlled competition works
- Go beyond ideological arguments ...
- At least discuss potential merits for public transport





3 - Bigger cars and their taxation

- Cars gain more in weight than people: +12 kg/yr
- Commission: 'abolish registration tax' = bigger & more cars




- MS should be free to decide what and how to tax ...
- Except for intentional loopholes



4 Investment, Trans-European Networks

- Link with urban transport ? YES!
- €40bn/yr theory, practice ?
- EU money €5bn/yr, no CBA
- Fiscally, economically & environmentally dubious
- Suck away resources for good smaller-scale projects







And finally

- Sustainable urban mobility needs more than examples
- Note the difference between words and deeds
- Real development needs real political investment:
- Politicians at all levels hold the keys
